Dear Training Director or Officer:

You and your colleagues have the opportunity to take a FREE TCLEOSE-certified course for which there has been much acclaim—our one-day class called *LAW ENFORCEMENT IN SOCIETY: Lessons of the Holocaust*. The Anti-Defamation League (ADL), Holocaust Museum Houston, and the Houston Police Department facilitate the class, which provides you with 8 hours of TCLEOSE certification for free! (DID WE MENTION FREE?)

The class, taught at Holocaust Museum Houston, 5401 Caroline, against the backdrop of the Holocaust, demonstrates and affirms how law enforcement officers are instrumental to upholding the fabric of our democracy. The class was developed as a joint project between the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, D.C., the ADL's Washington, D.C. office, and the U.S. Department of Justice.

The class takes place from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. It begins with a tour of the museum, followed by several sessions designed to make participants think about the role of police during the Holocaust, how that role changed during the period, and how their modern role is so different and so vital to our free and secure society. Participants break for lunch (which generally lasts an hour to an hour-and-a-half) between 11:15 a.m. and noon.

**Classes for 2010 will take place on June 10, September 16, and December 9.**
